**Introductions/Agency Updates:**

- Door County Medical Center: Barb shared that interviews have been scheduled for hiring a new provider.
- United Way: There will be a showing of the new film, *The Nutcracker*, on Saturday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>. A portion of the proceeds will benefit United Way of Door County.
- HELP of Door County: Halloween Ball on Saturday, October 27<sup>th</sup>

**Executive Committee Updates:**

- The Door County Partnership for Children and Families has hired their 3<sup>rd</sup> staff member – Chad Welch. He will begin as the Family Engagement Leader on Monday, October 29<sup>th</sup>.
- The Executive Committee has held a Strategic Planning session. They will continue to work on developing the Strategic Plan for the next few years.
- Dolly Parton's Imagination Library: The Door County Partnership for Children and Families will be bringing the Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program to Door County. This is a free book gifting program for Door County children. To qualify for the program, children must live in Door County and be under the age of 5. This program is FREE for families – there is no cost to register. The cost of the program (\$25 per child per year) is covered by the DCPCF and community donations.

**Events and Trainings**

- Mental Health Film and Panel Series
  - Recap of *Suicide: The Ripple Effect*
    - Approximately 40 people attended
    - Everyone liked the venue
    - Food from Mainstreet Market was good – a lot of food left over
    - 3 panel members
      - It would have been helpful if the film had a discussion guide to go with it

- Maybe it would have been beneficial for panel members to view the film ahead of time (this was not possible with the way that this film was sent to us)
  - Attendees asked how we could bring this information to the schools
    - The film may not be the best fit to bring to the schools – there were a few slower parts
    - Project 180 has added mental health to their priorities
- *Paper Tigers*

    - Light refreshments offered at 5:00. Film starts at 5:30. Panel starts at 7:00.

    - We can look at hosting this training in the Spring

### **Other**

- The Trauma Informed Care Core Team of Human Services has been discussing the possibility of doing a Trauma Informed Care conference. The DCPCF will look at the possibility of partnering with the Mental Health Focus Group, Human Services, and STRIDE to put this conference on in Spring/Summer 2019.
  - This may be of interest to school staff. If school staff would be interested, we should look at doing this during the summer months.
  - Human Services has some funding available to support keynote speakers, etc.
  - We should discuss this possibility with schools and then create a planning committee.
