Introductions/Agency Updates:

- Door County Human Services: They have hired a new CCS Case Manager and are recruiting for a Mental Health Therapist.
- Welcome Back Tenley!
- HELP: They have coats, gloves, hats available for clients and will be able to offer clients a Christmas shop.

Executive Committee Updates:

- The Door County Partnership for Children and Families hired a Family Engagement Leader, Chad Welch, who will be responsible for planning and coordinating family enrichment activities and events. He will be reaching out to many of you in the future (if he hasn't already) to learn about your programs.
- Strategic Planning: The Executive Committee has been working on the strategic plan for the next few years. The items in this plan are based on the feedback and input that was provided during the June Annual Celebration and the September Quarterly Partnership meeting.
- Imagination Library: Over the past few months, we have been working on bringing the Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program to Door County. This is a free, book gifting program for young children (birth to 5th birthday) in Door County. Registered children will receive a free book in the mail monthly.
 - This program is supported by the DCPCF, grants, and donations from the community. The cost of the program is \$25 per child per year.
 - The program will kick off at a free, family fun event at the Sturgeon Bay Library. We will be hosting a Glitter-Rama event on Saturday, December 15th, from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Families can come to learn more about Imagination Library and create fun holiday crafts.

Meet the student where they are at before diving into school work. The green, yellow & red "target" for talking w/consumers and the impact 1 person can make a huge difference. Normalizing ACES & teaching resilience. I will look into the research.
