The mission of the Door County Partnership for Children and Families is to promote resilience, strength, and social-emotional well-being for the families in our community.

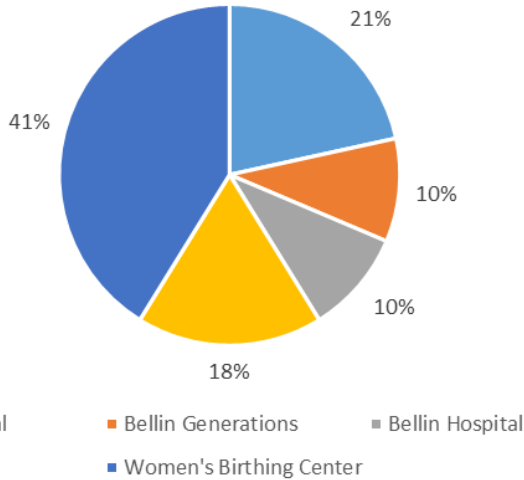

1. Chad training update – Chad has completed a ton of Triple P training and recertifications. He is taking a new Triple P training called Fear-Less (https://www.triplep.net/files/9515/9477/2089/ENG_Fear-Less_Triple_P_LTR.pdf)
2. DCPCF Updates
 - a. Dolly Parton Imagination Library – 721 active / 568 graduated
 - b. Block Party June 10th – well attended about 80 kids passed through. Waffle Blocks are still the most popular
 - c. Community Connections; Jan to May = 13 referrals and 148 diaper
 - d. Welcome Baby program – **Stats on next page.** Gina is now in her Family Resource Specialist role. She is experiencing challenges with engagement. Moms are not returning her calls or text. A couple ideas brought forward were to offer gift or gas cards. Gina is also going to check with Hospital Social Workers to see if she can get facetime with moms after birth.
3. Community Conversation Recap
 - a. Bring Block Parties to more community events
 - b. Drop-in childcare co-ops (Hope Church, Prince of Peace, Bayview may be interested in providing the space. Molly shared what Hope used to do long ago – they required each person using the childcare to work a shift on rotation with the other parents.
 - c. Access to resources – pair Community Connector role with Mental Health Navigator role to broaden reach throughout the county. There is more funding to tap into for mental health now.
 - d. Teen activities – start meeting with teens and even younger 3rd thru 8th graders to develop sustainable engagement and find out what they want. Project 180 kids, Youth in Government kids
 - e. Adulting for Teens – gather information from school staff, NWTC, student council members, former students to see what is already available and where the gaps are
 - f. Need to build volunteer pool – utilize Volunteer Connections to advertise for specific events/needs (unitedwaydc.com/volunteer-connections), tap into High School Service-Learning Hours requirement

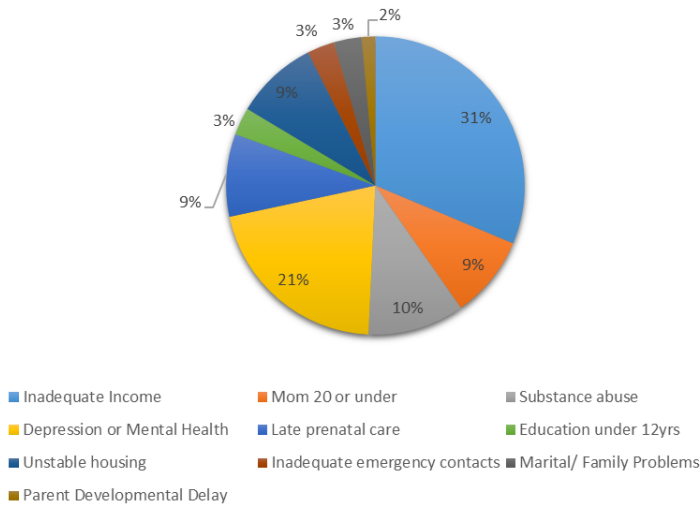
